In a few days, we will be entering the season of Advent. Can you believe that? Since March, our lives have been interrupted by COVID-19, and many feel like their lives are on hold. Yet, regardless of our feelings, time keeps passing and in a month, ready or not, we will celebrate Christmas. How did we get here? One day at a time. It is always one day at a time, isn't it?

In fact, that is exactly how Jesus instructed us to follow him. He said, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me" (Luke 9:23). I wondered why Jesus said "daily"? Why not monthly, yearly, or once and for all? My conclusion is that we need a daily reminder of who we are and whom we are following. Last year the average donation was \$40. Your generosity allowed us to provide gifts for 50 youth and young adults supported by Pathfinders of Milwaukee. This

means MUMC members provided gifts totaling approximately \$2000!! Amazing!

Repairers of the Breach Clothing Collection

December 27, 2020 - January 10, 2021

We are proud to support Repairers of Breach again this winter. This organization is doing so much to help homeless men and women in Milwaukee. Since we began partnering with them seven years ago, we have seen this ministry grow to include not only a daytime shelter, but also a medical clinic, a learning center, job seeking assistance, an art therapy studio, shower and laundry facilities, and a meal site.

This year we are collecting new underwear, socks, thermal underwear, gloves, winter hats and scarves for adults. Large sizes are especially needed. We are not collecting used clothing because of COVID-19. However, if your items are cleaned and packaged Repairers would be more than happy to have them. Bring your items to church and put them on the bench in the entrance. Mission Outreach will deliver donations once a week.

Thank you from the Mission Outreach Committee and Family Sharing of Ozaukee County whose Mission Statement is: "Helping serve the needs of low-income, elderly, and disabled residents of Ozaukee County."

As a congregation, MUMC members gathered and donated 65 very full bags of non-perishable Thanksgiving food items and 15 very large bags of clothing to Family Sharing of Ozaukee County! Your generosity is greatly appreciated by our Ozaukee County residents. Much gratitude!

Sobering Facts from Family Promise of Ozaukee County

Since March 13, 2020, Family Promise of Ozaukee County has provided emergency shelter to 52 homeless households (100 people - 60 adults and 40 children).

During the same time period in 2019, Family Promise provided shelter to 14 homeless households (35 people - 18 adults and 17 children).

Emergency shelter is not the only service Family Promise provides. Since March

13, 2020, the ministry has been able to prevent homelessness for 691 households by accessing government resources and providing rent assistance to keep people from losing their homes.

Let us be thankful for MUMC's Family Promise ministry, and our opportunity to volunteer and support our Ozaukee County Interfaith Network serving our neighbors who are at risk or are homeless. Our next opportunity to help directly will be during Christmas week and the week after. Contact Pam Layton or Connie Pukaite if you would like to help.

2020 Wisconsin Annual Conference Summary

Conference Theme "Imagine Wisconsin Anew"

The 2020 Wisconsin Annual Conference Session was held virtually on Saturday, October 24, 2020 from 9 am to 5:30 pm. This year's Annual Conference Session was held via ZOOM Webinar as the COVID-19 pandemic made it both unwise and unsafe to gather together in person. The Conference used the services of GNTV Media Ministry, a United Methodist-Related Media Services Company from Macon, Georgia, as the host for the ZOOM Webinar.

Pastor Sue Lee and Marilyn Meyer "attended" from MUMC.

Advent Wreath—The Advent wreath is a symbol of watchfulness and increasing joy as we anticipate Jesus' birth. The wreath's circular shape symbolizes eternity, or life without end. The candles remind us that Jesus is the Light of the World—he brought light and life to a dark world (see John 1:4-5). On each of the four Sundays of Advent, we light a new candle. As the light grows, so do our hope and joy.
