Concordia Research Study Seeks Volunteers 60+

Concordia University is launching a research study on fall risks for those 60+. They hope to learn if frequent falls are linked to the onset of dementia or if falls are the results of dementia; identify other conditions that trigger falls; and how to predict and prevent falls.

They need volunteers over 60, who can walk at least 50 feet, are free of orthopedic injury within the past 6 months and have had no heart problems within the past 3 months. The researchers want a wide range of volunteers who live a variety of lifestyles to participate in the study. (see flyer here or use the QR code above)

A Note From Our Pastor

My husband Chris and I visited Israel in 2017. The garden of Gethsemane on the Mount of Olives was one of the places we appreciated the most. We were emotionally and spiritually touched by being there in person as we stood at the very site of a great spiritual battle that our Lord faced on the night before His arrest. The story of Jesus pleading with His Father is extremely meaningful to His followers because His humanity is so evident. We can see that Jesus, the Godman, experienced fear, anxiety, and dread as He prayed. He responded to his imminent cross with feelings we are able to relate to and understand. Our Lord experienced the world as we do. And he won the great spiritual battle on His knees at Gethsemane. He prayed until His will was fully surrendered to the Father. Jesus left the garden as a prisoner, but at the same time He walked out the garden as the victorious Savior even before the resurrection because He had surrendered to God's will and left all consequences in God's almighty hands.
