Save the date! The children will share their love of Jesus with all during the church service.


Lunch Bunch Bible Study

From Pastor Sue

The most frequent question I receive from my fellow Christians who are serious about their faith is "What is God's will for *my life*?" When they ask me that question or when I am not clear about what God wants me to do, I remind them and myself of God's general will for all His people, for God would reveal His specific will for us as we practice HIs general will for us.

One of God's general wills is stated in 1Thessalonians 5:16-18: *"Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."* I suspect that rejoicing always is the hardest one to practice among those three. Here, Paul was not talking about being a Pollyanna Christian with a plastic smile on your face, pretending everything is okay, denying reality, and acting as if nothing is wrong. Friend, how could we be joyful in the midst of difficulties, hardships or injustice then? Paul's joy was only possible because he put his confidence in God not anyone, anything or circumstances.

Our life in this side of eternity is like sailing in the sea. During the journey, oftentimes we steer against the wind or storm of fear, disappointment or whatever it may be. But while we sail through the storm, our joyful attitude has nothing to do with how winds blow or what kind of the wind blows against us because for Christians, joy is a daily decision to enjoy the gift of salvation given by Jesus Christ, which is being adopted as a child of God through Jesus Christ. So let's decide to enjoy who we are in Christ in 2024 and beyond!
